

The Pupil Premium Strategy 2016-17

What is it?

The pupil premium is funding allocated to schools for the specific purpose of boosting the attainment of pupils from low-income families. Funding is based on children who have registered for a free school meal at any point in the last 6 years, children that are in care or adopted and children whose parents are currently serving in the armed forces.

Why has it been introduced?

The Government believes that the Pupil Premium, which is additional to main school funding, is the best way to address the current underlying inequalities between disadvantaged children and their peers by ensuring that funding to tackle disadvantage reaches the pupils who need it most. Whilst schools are free to spend the Pupil Premium as they see fit we are required to publish online information about how we have used the Premium and the impact it is having.

For the academic year September 2016 to July 2017 our school received £60,720 of Pupil Premium funding. The percentage of our pupils known to be eligible for free school meals or ever6 is: **41%** The national percentage is **26% (Primary)**

During 2015- 2016 we used the Pupil Premium in the following ways:

- Assistant Headteacher to support teaching and learning across the school £8,110.40
- HLTA in KS1 for language development interventions, phonics interventions £22,451
- HLTA in KS2 for upper KS2 streaming of maths and English, SPaG interventions £11,620
- TA to support social and emotional development at lunch time £1,008
- TA to provide nurture and positive play £9,327
- TA to provide Talk Boost interventions £2,276.10
- Talk Boost Intervention Pack £350
- LSA to support very vulnerable children engaging in school life £2,530.18
- Curriculum enrichment (Cornerstones curriculum) £3,575
- Numicon training and resources £636.93

This year (2016-2017) we plan to use the Pupil Premium as follows (estimated):

- Assistant Headteacher to support teaching and learning across the school £8,110.40
- HLTA in KS1 for English and maths interventions £12,961
- HLTA in KS2 for English and maths interventions £11,620
- TA to provide nurture and positive play and ensure very vulnerable children engage in school life £9379
- TA to provide Talk Boost interventions £2,276.10
- New library books and resources for the new library £3,000
- Parent workshops and resources (challenge activities) £2,000
- CPD for emotional health and well-being (training) £275
- Growth Mindset workshop for UKS2 to develop resilience and team building £300
