



School Uniform Policy Hartshorne C of E Primary School

Our policy is that all children should wear clothing that is in keeping with a purposeful learning ethos. We also believe that certain school activities are facilitated by specialised and appropriate clothing (including organised events outside normal school hours).

<p>Our policy is based on the belief that a school uniform:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✿ •promotes a sense of pride in the school ✿ •engenders a feeling of belonging ✿ •is practical and distinctive ✿ •identifies the children with the school ✿ •is not distracting in class (as fashion clothing might be) ✿ •makes children feel equal to one another in terms of appearance ✿ •reflects the sense both of community and of values that the school takes pride in ✿ •is regarded as suitable, and good value for money, by most parents <p>All children (Reception – Year 6) need:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✿ •royal blue crew neck sweat shirt/sweatshirt cardigan ✿ •white polo t-shirt or blouse ✿ •grey, navy or black school trousers/skirt/pinafore dress ✿ Black/dark flat sensible school shoes (shoes are to be plain with no coloured logos, plain black trainers are acceptable) ✿ •royal blue Hartshorne book bag ✿ •In summer blue gingham dress/pinafore/culottes and grey or black shorts may be worn <p>Optional royal blue Hartshorne zip fleece</p> <p>For PE all children (Reception – Year 6) need:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✿ •white T-shirt ✿ •black PE shorts or track-suit bottoms ✿ •plimsolls/trainers ✿ •Hartshorne gym bag to keep these in at school or another suitable PE bag <p>PE Kit should be worn for After School sporting clubs. All PE kits should be free from any logo or brand name, apart from the school logo.</p> <p>School Logo uniform can be ordered and purchased at the school office</p> <p>Local supermarkets sell royal blue uniform</p>	<p>On health and safety grounds, we do not allow children to wear jewellery to school (except for small studs and watches). We do not allow headwear to be worn during class time or inside school buildings, except for religious or medical reasons.</p> <p>All clothing should be clearly labelled with your child's name. This is especially important, as uniform items look similar and can easily be confused for another child's. The school cannot accept responsibility for any lost items.</p> <p>Long hair should be tied back to avoid it getting caught in equipment or trapped during any PE lesson. It is advisable all long hair is tied back as often as possible to prevent being accidentally cut with scissors or glued as well as preventing head lice spreading.</p>	<p>The Co-Headteachers are to ensure that pupils comply with the uniform policy agreed by the governing body.</p> <p>The Co-Headteachers have a duty to enforce the school uniform throughout the school community, as part of the duty within maintenance of day to day discipline in the school.</p> <p>The Co-Headteachers will speak to the parents of children who persistently do not wear the correct uniform.</p> <p>The school will follow the DfE guidelines and consider exclusion from the school where a pupil fails to comply with the school's rules on uniform</p>

	<p>All staff will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✿ Set a good example in terms of dress and self-assess any risks. ✿ Remember that in our respective roles we serve the local community as a set of professionals. ✿ Remind children to wear school uniform. The class teacher will speak to children who do not wear the correct uniform. If they still are not wearing the uniform they are to be referred to the co-headteachers 	
		Role of the Parents/Carers
		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✿ To ensure that their child / children adhere to the school's uniform policy. ✿ Ensure that they come to school in uniform everyday unless there are special circumstances such as non-uniform days. ✿ To ensure that all uniform is labelled correctly and clearly.
